Genesis 3:14-15

¹⁴ The LORD God said to the serpent, "Because you have done this, Cursed are you more than all cattle, And more than every beast of the field; On your belly you will go, And dust you will eat All the days of your life;

¹⁵ And I will put enmity Between you and the woman, And between your seed and <u>her seed</u>; He shall bruise you <u>on the head</u>, And you shall bruise him on the heel."

⁶ and you shall be to Me a kingdom of priests and a holy nation.' These are the words that you shall speak to the sons of Israel."

¹⁶ "Your house and your kingdom shall endure before Me forever; your throne shall be established forever." ' "


Breaking the Mosaic Covenant

Israel into Exile (734-712 BC)




The exile of peoples to and from Israel under the Assyrians, 734-712 BCE

Jeremiah 31:31-34

"Behold, days are coming," declares the LORD, "when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and with the house of Judah,

not like the covenant which I made with their fathers in the day I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt, My covenant which they broke, although I was a husband to them," declares the LORD.

Luke's Version

²⁰ And in the same way He took the cup after they had eaten, saying, "This cup which is poured out for you is the **new** covenant in My blood.

Types of Ancient Covenants

Туре	Pledge(s)	Ritual
Kinship (Parity)	Equal parties swear mutual oath	Typically includes a family meal
Grant	Only superior party swears the oath	Sacrifice???
Suzerain-Vassal	Superior party imposes oath on the subordinate	Self-malediction

- Genesis 26:26-35
 - Isaac makes peace with Abimilech concerning water rights
 - They share a feast together
 - They make oaths to each other
 - They depart in peace

Kinship Covenants

- 2 Genesis 31:43-55
 - Jacob meets Laban at Mizpah
 - Erects a stone pillar and a heap of stones as a witness between them
 - Jacob will not mistreat Rachel or Leah or take other wives
 - Laban will not lay claim to Jacob's herds
 - Exchanged oaths
 - Shared a meal
 - Departed in peace

Grant Covenants

 God's sworn covenant oath with Abraham at the "Sacrifice" at Mt. Moriah.

¹⁸ "In your seed all the nations of the earth shall be blessed, because you have obeyed My voice."

Suzerain-Vassal Treaties




- This form is common in the Ancient Near East in the Second Millennium BC.
- Suzerain = Greater King,
 Overlord
- Vassal = Lesser King

- 4. Provision for deposit in the temple and period public reading
- 5. The list of gods as witnesses
- 6. The curses and blessings formula
- 7. The formal oath
- 8. Solemn Ceremony
- 9. Procedure against rebellious vassal

Moses as Egyptian Prince
